


## **Cultures Creates Deserts**

There are natural deserts or fantastic dunes but that is not what we see here.





Once upon a time, Ethiopia had a rich culture, religion, and history. Today it reminds us of famine. Where are the trees?




If it's true that culture creates a desert. Then if you knew or not where the culture of the Inca Empire was you will expect to find a desert there today.


Australia is the surprise with a culture older than you can imagine, once part of the single Pangaea continent. It's the Ark of Noah.
